

**Dr. Ivan Sascha Sheehan** is an Associate Professor of Public and International Affairs at the University of Baltimore where he is Executive Director of the School of Public and International Affairs. Sheehan previously served as the director of the *Conflict Management* graduate program and was the founding director of the *Global Affairs and Human Security* graduate program in the College of Public Affairs. An award-winning faculty member, Sheehan is the recipient of the 2015 University of Baltimore President's Faculty Award, the 2016 University System of Maryland Board of Regents Award, and a 2017 citation from the Maryland State Senate in recognition of "Exceptional leadership and Service to the University of Baltimore."

Dr. Sheehan's research focuses on terrorism, counterterrorism, regime change in Iran, and U.S. foreign policy in the Middle East. His articles have appeared in *The National Interest, Foreign Policy, Fox News, Al Jazeera, The Washington Times, The Hill, Roll Call, The Washington Examiner, The Baltimore Sun, Haaretz, The Jerusalem Post, National Post, United Press International, Townhall.com, Newsmax, The Daily Caller, Independent Journal Review, New York Daily News, and in numerous academic journals.* 

Dr. Sheehan frequently speaks on policy-oriented matters in Washington, D.C. and participates in academic conferences around the world. Sheehan's early scholarship – including his first book and numerous journal articles – involved quantitative analyses of terrorism incident data and the impact of preemptive force on terrorist activity. He has published in peer-reviewed journals on topics related to evidence-based counterterrorism policy, terrorism studies, foreign terrorist organizations, counterinsurgency, suicide terrorism, and regime change in the Middle East. Sheehan's latest work has involved both peer-reviewed scholarship and policy-oriented writing on the Islamic Republic of Iran, the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action, and the Iranian opposition.

Over the past 10 years, Dr. Sheehan has addressed diverse audiences from academic forums in Europe and at Harvard Law School to policymakers in the U.S. Congress and the National Press Club. He continues to serve as a subject matter expert and consultant on a range of national security issues and public policy matters.

Between 2007-09 Sheehan served on the faculty of the University of Massachusetts Boston in the McCormack School of Policy Studies.
